Jack serves as President of Advocacy Resources, a consulting practice based in Tallahassee, previously he served as President of Voices for Florida's Children for 25 years. He holds an MS in Child Development and Family Studies from Purdue University and a degree in English from Hunter College (City University of New York). Jack's expertise is in developing and delivering messages on the value of preventive investments in children, parental leadership, grandparent activism and dignified services for elders. He is the Partnership Director for GRAND magazine, a national publication on energetic grandparenting.

Jack's Keynote Address is entitled: "Making a Difference: The Advocacy Lessons I Learned at My Grandma Minnie's Kitchen Table." After Jack's talk, we'll take a break, then move to a discussion of our programs for children and youth followed by lunch, breakout sessions and workshops ranging from "Chaos in the RE classroom is NOT a UU Principle," "Ungluing their Lips: Nurturing Adolescent Participation" and "Tips and Procedures for new RE teachers."
